Architecture and Economics: The National Council of Architects welcomes on April 4th in Padua Paul Krugman, Nobel Laureate in Economics

International Seminar: "The Wealth of Nations and the Role of Architecture: Towards a Human-Centered Urban Economy"

The Seminar will be streamed live on the official YouTube channels of the National Council of Architects.

Padua, April 2nd 2025 – Renowned international thinkers, including the Nobel Laureate in Economics Paul Krugman, together with economists, architects, and urban planning experts, will gather in Padua to discuss a central question: **how can cities become engines of well-being in today's economy?**

This discussion will take place on Friday, April 4th 2025, from 2:30 PM to 6:30 PM, in the Aula Magna of the University of Padua – the historic lecture hall where Galileo Galilei once taught – during the "The Wealth of Nations and the Role of Architecture: Towards a Human-Centered Urban Economy" international seminar.

Organized by the National Council of Architects, Planners, Landscapers and Conservationists (CNAPPC), together with its Scientific Committee chaired by Prof. Carlos Moreno (Sorbonne), in collaboration with the Department of Economics and Business Sciences ("Marco Fanno") of the University of Padua and the Regional Science Association, the event places architecture at the heart of the debate on the future of cities, economics, and society.

The seminar aims to explore the foundations of a fair, sustainable, and human-centered proximity, at the intersection of architecture, economics, and the social sciences.

Following the institutional greetings by Antonio Parbonetti, Deputy Rector of the University of Padua; Paola Valbonesi, Director of the Department of Economics and Business Sciences ("Marco Fanno"); Andrea Micalizzi, Deputy Mayor of Padua; Roberto Righetto, President of FOAV and of the Order of Architects of Padua – the seminar will start with speeches by Massimo Crusi, President of CNAPPC, and Senator Roberto Rosso, Rapporteur on the Urban Regeneration Law in the Senate.

An outstanding lecture will then be delivered by **Paul Krugman**, **Nobel Laureate in Economics**, entitled "Deplorable Policy Roads", a clear analysis of the political and territorial malfunctions shaping our cities.

Two main sessions will structure the event: "Contemporary Struggles: Discomfort, Urban Life, and Governance" and "What Kind of City Do We Want to Live In?". The sessions will be moderated by Catherine Gall, Executive Director of ETI Research – Sorbonne, and will feature contributions from Carlos Moreno, Karima Kourtit, Philippe Rahm, Robin Wells, Roberto Antonietti, and Peter Nijkamp.

The seminar will conclude with remarks by **Giuseppe Cappochin**, Head of the Urban Reform and Future of the City CNAPPC's Department.
